



ENGLISH AND HISTORY PHD CO-OP APPLICATION CHECKLIST 2017/2018

Submission Process

To apply for either the English or History PhD Co-op Program, you must complete and submit the following applications documents by 4:00 pm on Wednesday, October 11, 2017. Late and/or incomplete applications will not be considered.

Step 1: Submit an online application form

- Complete an application at <https://arts-ubc-csm.symplicity.com/students>.
- Complete the form in one session. Once you submit your online application, your responses cannot be revised.

Step 2: Email your application documents

- Email documents below in ONE PDF to Isabella Squarisi at isabella.squarisi@ubc.ca by 4:00 pm on Wednesday, October 11, 2017.
- PDF document filename must be “PhD-[last name]-[first name]-[student number].pdf” (eg. “PhD-Fan-Jamie-12345678.pdf”)
- Email subject line must be “PhD Co-op Application 2017/18”

a) A typed, standard application cover letter (max 1 page)

- In your cover letter, please provide developed responses to the following:
 - Why do you want to be in the Co-op Program?
 - Why should you be accepted? (Discuss the skills, attributes, and experience you would bring to the program, and to the employers who hire Co-op students.)
 - What are your career goals, and how will Co-op assist you with those career goals?
 - What specific Co-op work experiences are you interested in gaining through your Co-op work terms? How would the Co-op Program enhance your academic studies?
- Your cover letter should be addressed to:

- For cover letter guidelines/tips, refer to UBC Student Services’ Build My Career web section (<http://students.ubc.ca/career>), but customize your letter to highlight your writing style and experiences.

b) A resume (max 2 pages)

- In your resume, please consider including the following items:
 - Previous and current work experience and nce and duties explained
 - Any special skills/accomplishments you think an employer would be interested in knowing (e.g. music, athletics, memberships to associations, scholarships, special projects, etc.)
 - Extra-curricular activities
 - Other languages and your degree of fluency
 - Specific writing skills (for example: specific courses, work samples, publications, etc.).
 - Research and computer skills (list the computer programs you are familiar with), such as:

Evaluation Criteria: For both the cover letter and resume, you will be evaluated on the professionalism of your format/style, content, coherence of writing, and correctness of mechanics (grammar/spelling).

- c) References** – Contact information for 2-3 references who are able to speak about your professional attribute, skills, and experience. Please submit these on a separate page from your resume.



Eligibility

To be eligible for Co-op, you must meet the following criteria. (International students and SSHRC holders are eligible to apply.)

- You are in or are about to begin Year 2 or 3 of the PhD program
- You have achieved candidacy or can reasonably expect to do so by June 2018
- You are in good academic standing
- You are willing to attend a mandatory orientation and pre-employment conference (Saturday January 13th, 2018)

Co-op Work Term Schedule Planner:

In order to assist with your planning, and to give the Arts Co-op Office an indication of when you will be available for your work terms, it is important that you develop an academic/work plan. While course changes or conflicts may arise, students accepted into Co-op are expected to follow this schedule as closely as possible and to be in contact with their Co-op Coordinator about changes to this schedule.

Please keep a copy of your intended schedule for yourself.

Directions:

For each term, check a box to indicate whether you will be pursuing PhD work or working in the Co-op Program

Guidelines:

- Choose three work terms, distributed among the second to fifth years of your PhD program
- Normally, the first work term will be in the summer or fall following your acceptance into the Co-op Program
- Students **must have achieved candidacy** before they can begin their first work term
- Students who hold SSHRC grants must complete at least one term of academic work between co-op work terms; all others may choose up to two consecutive co-op work terms
- Normally, the last term will be focused on your dissertation and defense

Remember, this is a plan. Changes can be made with new information at a later point if necessary.
